**Call for Posters – OHHIT Symposium October 29, 2007**

The Ohio Health Information Technology Symposium seeks abstracts for poster sessions to be used at the second annual meeting. Posters are sought from organizations who work in Ohio using health information technology. The purpose of the poster presentations is to acquaint meeting participants with projects that have been initiated across the state of Ohio. Vendor participation will be limited to presentations on specific projects that are in operation in Ohio. The emphasis for all such posters is on what is working in what situations and the technology upon which it is based.

To be considered for a poster session, you must submit an abstract that includes:

1. Title of the Poster Session
2. For each author:
  - a. Full first or middle name
  - b. Last Name
  - c. Credentials
  - d. Workplace or school (e.g. Ohio University)
  - e. Street address or P.O. Box (Please do not repeat workplace or school name here.)
  - f. City
  - g. State/Province (US and Canada only)
  - h. Country
  - i. Phone Number
  - j. e-mail Address
3. A 250 word abstract describing the target audience, learning objectives, location of the project and any partnering organizations.
4. A statement disclosing your financial interest in this project, or a statement that you have no financial interest involved in this project.

A poster presentation is a visual presentation of key elements of your health IT project that includes successes, lessons learned, a display or statement describing current functionalities. Authors are encouraged to report on number of records in operating systems, partnering organizations, vendor products used, etc. These visual presentations should be combined with informal discussion between the presenters and the audience. Authors illustrate their findings by displaying graphs, photographs, diagrams and limited text on poster boards. Authors hold discussions with registrants who circulate among the poster boards. The poster boards measure six feet wide by 4 feet high, and each session last 90 minutes. Presenters are expected to remain by their board for the duration of the session. No audio visual equipment is permitted for this format.

Abstracts will be reviewed by a committee for inclusion and selections will be based on merit of the presentation. Abstracts must be submitted by 8/31/2007 in Microsoft Word document format.
